A brief history

Late 2009:

- Dean Armstrong (CANR) proposes to eliminate Forestry Department (among others) & to create an interdepartmental forestry program

- alternative was to merge with Fisheries & Wildlife
- Late 2010 / early 2011:
 - Dean Armstrong leaves MSU.
 - Merger still planned

Spring 2011:

- Merger falls apart

- Forestry stands as an independent Department

1 July 2011 – Rich Kobe starts as Interim Chair

Moving forward on several fronts:

- 1. New structure for Department; Directors of:
 - Graduate Studies
 - Undergraduate Studies
 - Technology & Communications
- 2. New Graduate Certificate in Forest Carbon Science, Policy & Management
 - stand-alone Certificate or as part of MS program
 - likely 1st program of its kind globally
- 3. Professional MS program in Forestry
 - set of core courses
 - specializations: Carbon, Bio-energy plantations

4. Comprehensive review of our undergraduate curriculum
- e.g., use of remotely sensed images for forest inventory

5. Discussing an undergraduate internship programbuild on an outstanding alumni network

6. Building a video display in front lobby focused on undergrad recruitment
