Increasingly, forestry professionals are expected to integrate climate change into plans, documents, and activities.

- Stakeholder-driven concerns on public lands
- More prescriptive agency policies & guidance
- Forest certification
- Long-term economic forecasts

Regardless of whether initiated by a professional or outside entity, there is a greater need to understand and **communicate** information about climate change to diverse audiences.

 Seen as politically contentious even though scientifically accepted




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

- 3) Need to avoid mental shutdown to have meaningful discussion

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
#### WHAT TO DO?

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## When it's a direct issue

#### Don't beat around the bush.

- Somebody else has brought it up as an issue.
- Climate change raises a concern that is pertinent to management.
- You want to show that you've considered climate change.

#### SOME ADDITIONAL TIPS

#### HOW TO SAY IT

#### Extreme events resonate.

"Intense precipitation events are becoming more common, so it might be a good time to invest in a larger culvert"

#### HOW TO SAY IT

#### Be specific.

Climate change is too vague.

"We're expecting warmer and drier conditions in the future, so it might make sense to use bigger gaps to increase regeneration of species that do well under those conditions"


#### HOW TO SAY IT

#### List several reasons

• List climate change as one of many reasons.

"This management action will diversify the forest, improve growth of valuable timber species, and help adapt the forest to climate change"
